UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Youth Commission work plan & subcommittee development

- a. **Environment:** Events for the year include trash cleanups, tree plantings, an Earth day fair at a Campbell park, recycling programs and a compost program; Trash Clean up schedule for December 7th will be postponed to January 25th; more details to come; in the process of planning Earth Day event which will be held in April
- b. **Civic Engagement:** Coffee & Politics was a really great event with multiple high school students in attendance; Commissioners were thankful that City Council and CUHSD board members were in attendance; Commissioners to have an upcoming event like this in the spring; Voter registration event will happen in spring
- c. **College & Beyond:** Events for the year include the annual job fair in January, a scholarship information night, a workshop for juniors in the spring that talks about college; and an AP test prep class in April; Job Fair scheduled for January 31st in partnership with the Civic Improvement Commission; flyer for Job Fair to be made; College Workshop should be scheduled for an earlier day next year
- d. **Mental Health:** Events for the year include the NAMI presentation after school,

therapy dogs in December and in the spring, a mental health distress day at the Cinelux Theatres, and a new initiative called “humans of Campbell” where teens are featured on the Campbell Youth Commission Instagram; Next Door Solutions Holiday Drive also included with this committee; Commissioner Gadagkar and Staff Liaison Bybee will be in contact with CUHSD to organize dates and locations for Therapy Dogs

- e. **Website:** Commissioners Yarkov, Garcia and Ido will be in charge of creating flyers for all upcoming events; in the process of completing the teens website which will launch soon
 - f. **Academic:** A potential reading day at a local elementary school (Forest Hill or Rosemary is in the works; tutoring event will be every first Monday of the month from 4-5pm at the Campbell Library; Campbell Library will be hosting the snacks/drinks for the tutoring; next tutoring day is February 3rd; Commissioners have been requested to find tutor volunteers for the year
 - g. **Seniors:** Events include winter craft event with preschool kids and seniors in February, and a Nature Day/Walk in the spring; Valentines event for seniors and preschool is to be determined
 - h. **Recreation:** Events for this subcommittee include Movie Nights, Winter Wonderland, a middle school Library Lock-In in the spring, a cake walk in January to raise funds for a specific organization, and a Leprechaun Trap Making event in March; Movie Night was held at the library with great attendance from middle school students; Winter Wonderland will be held Saturday, December 14 from 1:00-2:30pm in E-46; flyer made by Commissioner Gadagkar; next Movie Night will be on March 27th; movie TBD
