REPORTS FROM REPRESENTATIVES: There were no reports from the County or Campbell Library for the month of January.

NOTE: Effective May 2019, the CIC approved that the Library will rotate their reports to the Commission every other month. As the "Measure O" library renovations are underway, the library will report updates to the Commission more frequently.

REPORTS FROM STAFF:

Kerry Perkins – Museum Supervisor: A video featuring the City of Campbell's history was presented to the Commission. Following the video Ms. Perkins provided a written and oral report highlighting the Museum's events for the month of January. A written copy of this report was distributed during the meeting and is included as "Attachment A" to these minutes.

Tina Wong-Erling – Senior Services Supervisor: Ms. Wong-Erling provided an oral report highlighting the Adult Center activities for the month of January. A written copy of this report was included as an attachment to the agenda.

Al Bito – Staff Liaison:

City Projects and Events:

The City Council approved a four-year contract with Urban Village, operator of the Farmers Market. The Contract will run thru June 30, 2024. The Mercury News voted the City of Campbell's Farmers Market the best Farmers Market for the past 15 years.

On Tuesday, January 21 the City Council will hear an appeal regarding Chick-fil-A. The Planning Commission approved the project; however, there is residential concern.

A new salon chain "Sola Salon" will occupy the former "Aaron Brothers Art and Framing" location at the Hamilton Plaza on Bascom Avenue.

At their December 17, 2019 meeting, the City Council elected Susan Landry as Mayor and Liz Gibbons as Vice Mayor.

Mayor Landry has invited the Neighborhood Associations and representatives from the Commissions and Boards, to a Roundtable meeting at the end of January.

The Chamber of Commerce is interested in doing a "Meet the Candidates" forum for Senator Jim Beall's seat representing Senate District 15. Nora Campos, Dave Cortese and John Khamis are anticipated to attend. More details to follow.

Staff liaison Bito reminded the Commission of the upcoming CIC Winter Social at Pacific Catch at 7:30 p.m. on January 16.

Staff liaison Bito announced the appointment of the Campbell Police Chief to Captain Gary Berg.

Staff liaison Bito thanked Tina Wong-Erling, as interim staff liaison, and recording secretary Johnson for their assistance in support of the Commission for this past year in his absence.

Neighborhood Association Assistance Grant: There were six applications received. The applications are consistent with prior requests. Applications will be forwarded to the Commission prior to the next Commission meeting.

Beautification Grant: The deadline to apply is January 31. No applications have been received to date. There was some interest from Campbell Village Neighborhood to do another landscaping project. Outreach included Social Media, NextDoor, City Website and Mayor's Announcements.


Campbell Cares: Nothing to report.

Civic Improvement Commission / Museum Report January 2020

New Education/ Orientation Video for Historical Museum complete:

- Grant provided by the Farrington Historical Foundation to the Campbell Museum Foundation to create a new updated education/ orientation video. Video created by **Fixed Heart Films**.

Exhibits:

Spring Ainsley House Exhibit:

- The Museum will host a juried Art show in the Carriage House. The goal is to host an art show every two years, with 2020 being the inaugural show. The theme for 2020 is "Joy," and is open to the artist's interpretation. Artists must be local to Santa Clara County. 2D art preferred (photos, drawings, paintings, prints, digital art printed on paper, etc.). 3D art has limited space, but small 3D works will be considered. We will have two age groups: ages 6-17 and ages 18+ We will have one winner for each group (4 winners total): 2D 6-17, 2D 18+, 3D 6-17, 3D 18+. Work will be judged by a panel of museum staff and community leaders and members, as well as public votes. There will be two winners (one per age category). The winner will be selected to have their work enlarged into murals: one to hang outside the Museum and visible from Civic Center Drive, and the other City Hall.

New Outdoor Panel for Ainsley House/ Carriage House

- The current outdoor panel that details the history of the Ainsley House was installed in 2012. The panel is fading badly and not in the best location. Staff is working with our exhibit designers to create a new panel to be installed on the outside sliding doors of the Carriage House. The new panel will be updated and include information about public tour hours.

League of Women Voters exhibit at the Heritage Theater:

- The Museum is working with the southwest chapter of the League of Women Voters to install a temporary exhibit at the Heritage Theater in May and June. The exhibit will feature panels that details the work of the League in the last 100 years in celebration of the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Women's Right to Vote.

Events:

- **History Happy Hour: Friday, March 6:** Aisha Piracha-Zakariya, State Board of Directors for the League of Women Voters. She will discuss the History of the League of Women Voters in celebration of this year's 100th Anniversary of women's right to Vote, as well as discuss how the League will help with the 2020 Census.

- **March 8: Ainsley House Art Show Exhibit Opening.**
- **March 23 @ the Historical Museum:** Family Author Day: Children's Book Author: Venus Sharp Martinez, "Sami and the Orange Balloon: Adventures Over Campbell" will read her story to families. The museum will offer crafts and activities that compliment the story.
- **April 25: Campbell Museum Foundation Spring Gala:** This will be an evening event held at OCBH. The them for the event is: 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Women's Right to Vote and feature three local women in politics from the local, state or national level. There will also be a silent auction. Proceeds from the event help the Museum Foundation support the Campbell Museums.

## Silicon Valley Reads 2020 Kicks Off on January 23

Silicon Valley Reads is a premier annual literary event that engages residents of all ages to read, discuss and engage around a theme relevant to the Bay Area. This year's theme is [Women: Making it Happen](#), marking the centennial anniversary of women's suffrage in the United States.

From the tenacious individuals who worked hard to get women the right to vote, to the women and girls in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century breaking gender barriers to excel in all areas of life, this year's featured titles include remarkable stories from Julian Guthrie, author of [Alpha Girls](#), and Catherine Chung, author of [The Tenth Muse](#).

**A special event kickoff is scheduled for Thursday, January 23 at 7:30pm at De Anza College's Visual & Performing Arts Center in Cupertino.** Author Julian Guthrie and the four women featured in [Alpha Girls](#) – Mary Jane Elmore, Theresia Gouw, Sonja Perkins and Magdalena Yesil, will participate in a panel discussion moderated by *Mercury News* columnist Sal Pizarro.

*Alpha Girls* is the untold story of pioneering women in Silicon Valley venture capital. Described as "Hidden Figures" meets "The Social Network," *Alpha Girls* is the story of the real unicorns of Silicon Valley -- the women who bucked the system and found ways to survive and thrive in this high-stakes, male-dominated world. The book explores the rise of such companies as



Facebook, Tesla, Oracle, Trulia, Imperva, F5 Networks, Acme Packet, ForeScout, Salesforce and more – all through the eyes of trailblazing "alpha girls" of Silicon Valley who helped build these companies. The book is being adapted for a television series by Academy Award-winning producer Cathy Schulman and TriStar.

Doors open at 6:45 pm. No tickets or reservations are required for this free event, and seating is on a first come, first served basis. There is free parking in Lot A starting at 5 pm. The campus bookstore will sell copies of the book before and after the program, with Guthrie and the "Alphas" available for autographs afterwards.

The adjacent Euphrat Museum of Art will be open 6:30-7:30 p.m. and during the book signing for free viewing of the exhibit "Women Pathmakers." "Women Pathmakers" honors women whose courage and creativity helped change the world. Those featured include pioneer mathematicians, the first computer programmer, Nobel Prize winning scientists, civil rights activists, artists and musicians. Other artworks are inspired by the movement for women's voting rights, displaced immigrant populations and the impacts on women and girls, and the invisible labor of women of color.

**Helping Homebound Library Users**

**New policy provides greater access for seniors, people with limited mobility**

The Santa Clara County Library District (SCCLD) is making it easier for homebound County library district residents to receive items they want from the Library. Those who find themselves confined at home for three or more months, for whatever reason, can now designate a person to pick up items for them at their local library or the SCCLD Bookmobile.



This new policy provides convenience and ensures that our patrons can obtain books, movies and other items with more ease and potentially, greater frequency as the designated borrower can pick up

and deliver materials for the homebound patron. Currently, library staff delivers items requested by registered homebound patrons approximately once a month and will continue to deliver items to those registered homebound patrons without a designated borrower.

While a small program with just under 100 participants currently, homebound services are important to the non-ambulatory seniors, persons with disabilities, and otherwise incapacitated individuals who rely on them. Homebound persons can specify a Designated Borrower by filling out an [application](#) on SCCLD's new website.

"These great measures will help people whose lack of mobility would otherwise limit their access to library materials," said County Supervisor and Library Joint Powers Authority Board Chairman Mike Wasserman. "Once again, SCCLD is working hard to make library services more convenient and accessible for all patrons."

## Multiple Library Upgrades Coming in 2020

Looking ahead in 2020, we have Library upgrades on the horizon for three of our libraries including Cupertino, Campbell and Morgan Hill.

Morgan Hill: The Morgan Hill Library expansion is already underway with a 2,500 square foot addition that will expand the children's area and add a second community room to the library. The projected completion date is Summer 2020




