1. The Youth Commission was invited to the YAC Social on Saturday, November 4th. Commissioners will attend the social event and be able to network with youth commissioners from other cities.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Commission Roles

- a. Commissioner Ayaan was voted to be Vice Chair. Commissioner Chloe remained impartial as chair while voting in order to break the tie between two nominees.

2. Work Plan Discussion

- a. The youth commission shared their thoughts regarding the work plan and presentation to City Council from October 3rd. The commission thought that the presentation successfully expressed the goals for this year. Some details that changed within the work plan would have to be reported out during the subcommittee updates.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Oktoberfest Fun Run

- a. Volunteer opportunities for the Oktoberfest Fun Run were shared. Commissioners on the Physical Health Subcommittee all planned to volunteer Saturday morning, and the rest of the commissioners were provided the information for volunteer registration and encouraged to sign up.

2. Subcommittee Updates

- a. Each subcommittee provided updates on proposed projects and timelines for the term. Plans for Ainsley House Decorating in November and Safety Awareness Week (via Social Media) in December were solidified. Events such as the job fair, shoe drive, school partnerships for college workshops and resources, May mental health awareness month, teen gym days, and Valentine Fun Run partnership were still rough drafts, but would ideally occur in the Spring.

3. Statewide Initiative on Physical Fitness and Mental Well-being

- a. The initiative was read through and there was an expressed interest in involvement and participation. The commission recommended assigning a point of contact after the meeting.

4. Virtual Youth Town Hall

- a. There was a unanimous vote made to not attend this town hall event as a group. Motion was made by Oliveira, seconded by Buran. Commissioners would be more than welcome to participate in the event, but not to represent the Youth Commission.

5. Santa Clara VTA Winchester Station Access Study

- a. The VTA Winchester Station project focuses on getting feedback for improvements. The youth commission voted all in favor of watching a short zoom

presentation from VTA during the public comments portion of the next meeting, as well as promoting their survey. Motioned by Oliveira, seconded by Dey.
