Corbin Schneider representative from Verde Design, gave a presentation of the two proposed concepts.

The City Council commented on concerns with the budget versus actual construction cost, noise in relation to the sensory area, the proposed area for a stage. The City Council also discussed increasing ADA parking, updating the schedule and receiving information on the implications of long term maintenance. The City Council gave feedback on the options and stated a general preference for option one with an interest to add a netting structure to that option.
