

# FINAL NOTICE

## What to Expect:

### 1. PREPARATION

ADA ramp installation and associated curb and sidewalk repairs. Pavement repairs. Lowering of manholes and valve covers to prepare for grinding.



### 2. GRINDING



A thin layer of failed asphalt is milled or recycled in preparation for the placement of a new asphalt layer.

### 3. PAVING

Road sprayed with oil. Placement and compaction of hot asphalt concrete. Asphalt is delivered by trucks, spread with a paving machine, and compacted with heavy rollers.



### 4. UTILITY ADJUSTMENTS



Manholes or valve covers are adjusted to match the elevation of the new pavement.

### 5. STRIPING AND LEGENDS

Striping and legends are reapplied and replacement pavement markers are glued. Some streets will be redesigned with new pedestrian and bike facilities.



## Project Information:

Your street has been selected for roadway improvements this year. The scope of work for the project includes:

- New/upgraded Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant ramps for pedestrian safety
- Failing pavement will be removed and replaced with new asphalt to increase its service life
- New traffic striping for vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian delineation



 <p>Construction operations will affect traffic patterns, so pay close attention to signs and detours.</p>	<p>Pay attention to the dates and times on the TOW AWAY - NO STOPPING signs and changeable message boards (electronic signs).</p>
<p>For businesses: customer traffic will be affected. However, at least one driveway entering the parking lots will be maintained when possible.</p>	 <p>If you encounter an unsafe situation, contact the contractor or City immediately.</p>
 <p>For residents: plan extra time for travel.</p>	<p>When traveling in the construction zone, slow down and stay alert. Be ready for changes in traffic patterns.</p>
<p>Your scheduled garbage collections should not be impacted by paving operations. Should you have any questions or concerns regarding collections, please call customer service at (408) 535-3500.</p>	 <p>Share this information with your family members, tenants, guests, and neighbors.</p>
 <p>Vehicles and trailers will be cited and <b>towed</b> if parked in the posted <b>TOW AWAY - NO STOPPING</b> area.</p>	<p>Park in areas that will not affect the construction operation.</p>
