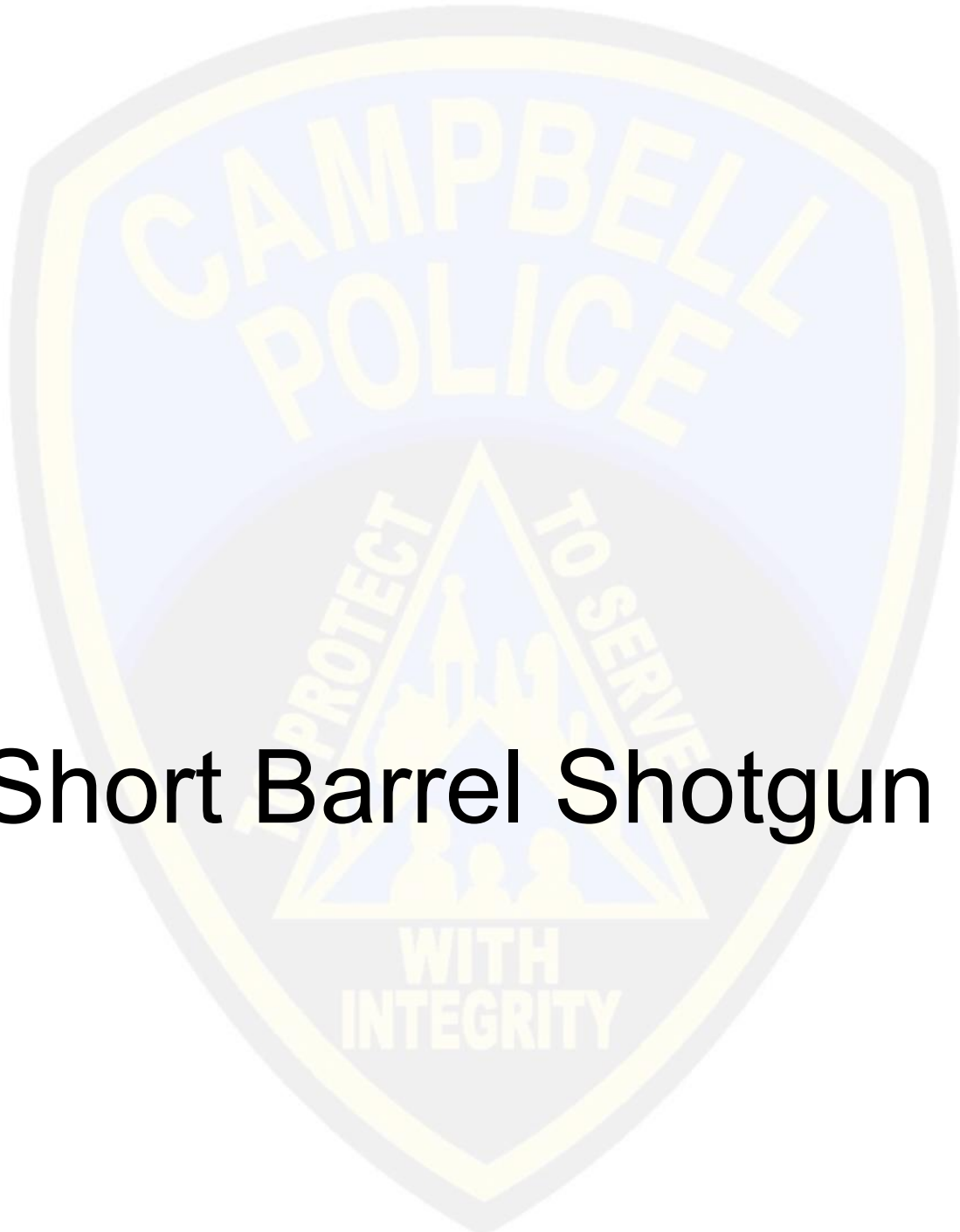

Range Safety Rules

1. Handle all firearms as if they were loaded.
2. Always keep muzzle pointed in a safe direction.
3. Keep your finger off the trigger and out of the trigger guard until ready to fire.
4. Always check your target, backstop and the surrounding area before firing.



Range Safety (cont.)

- Safety is the responsibility of everyone if you see something unsafe call it out!
- Anyone may call “Cease fire!!!” on the range
- Do not sweep or cover anybody regardless of if the weapon is clear
- Range trauma kit
- Body armor, eye and ear protection is required!



Range Safety (cont.)

- Listen carefully to all range commands.
- Request clarification if not clear.
- Keep the muzzle pointed down range and request help by raising your free hand.
- Keep the shotgun slung until instructed to remove by Instructors/Range Staff



Range Safety (cont.)

- Never transfer a weapon to another person unless it has been made safe.
- Do not go in front of your firing line or bend down to pick up anything until the firing line has been declared safe.
- No ammo in classroom.
- Know the condition of your firearm at all times.

Short-barreled Shotgun Defined

PC 17180

- (a) A Firearm that is designed or redesigned to fire a fixed shotgun shell and has a barrel or barrels of less than 18 inches in length
- (b) A firearm that has an overall length of less than 26 inches that is designed or redesigned to fire a fixed shotgun shell
- (c) Any weapon made from a shotgun if that weapon, as modified, has an overall length of less than 26 inches or a barrel or barrels of less than 18 inches in length

Possession of a Short Barreled Shotgun

PC 33215

Except provided in Sections 33220 and 33225, any person who manufactures or causes to be manufactured, imports into the state, keeps for sale, or offers or exposes for sale, or who gives, lends, or possesses and short barreled rifle or short barreled shotgun.

Possession of a Short Barreled Shotgun

PC 33220

- PC 33215 does not apply to the following
 - Peace Officer
 - On duty
 - Authorized by agency
 - Within course and scope of duties
 - Attended POST course

Nomenclature



Nomenclature

Forward for **FIRE**

When the selector is forward a **red dimple** will appear indicating the shotgun is ready to fire.

Rearward for **SAFE**

When the selector is to the rear no red dimple will be present and the shotgun is rendered safe.
